Exercise: Laurillard's model

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(Education lectures in level 4 APEC option)

- 1a. Pick a particular topic you yourself have been taught (e.g. a dance class, statistics, social psychology, IT skills, how to write a CV, schizophrenia...). A small topic may be easier to think specifically and in detail about.
- 1b. Now sketch out how it was taught: what mixture of reading, lectures, workshops, exercises, labs etc.
- 1c. Now go over all 12 of Laurillard's activities, and say how each of these was covered, and if not whether that omission mattered, and how it could be covered.
- 2a. Think of a topic to be taught (e.g. first aid, how a gas fired power station works, existential philosophy, how to keep personal accounts, the psychology of gender differences). A small topic may be easier to think specifically and in detail about.
- 2b. Now sketch out how you would recommend it is taught: what mixture of reading, lectures, workshops, exercises, labs etc.
- 2c. Now go over all 12 of Laurillard's activities, and say how each of these is covered in your plan (or why it is unnecessary to cover it).
